How to make it as a music graduate II: Thinking about the future

This resource is designed to help students reflect on their development, their motivations, their attitude to study, and their perceptions of success. The resource weaves these issues around a short career story from a 15-year old student musician in the US.

Time allowance

The resource works well as a reading, in which case you may want to set some reflective questions. Ideally, leave 15 minutes for in-class discussion so that students can share their thoughts with colleagues.

Extensions and adaptations

You might want to set a series of musician career stories over a semester. If you do this, consider using the <u>Guide to Career Stories</u>. Alternatively, use this <u>Critical Reflection resource</u> to frame written reflections on a pertinent question.
