



Careers panel: How did you get here?

An excellent way to learn about interesting careers of professionals is to attend or host a careers panel. If you plan to host a panel, invite three to five people and ask them to be prepared to tell their story: to answer the question, "How did you get here?".

Careers panels generally take between 60 and 90 minutes and they work best if the room is small enough not to need microphones. The sample questions on the following page provide some examples, but challenge attendees to supplement these with at least three of their own. You can use the ticket at the end to ensure they do this. Ask everyone to think about what they really want to know!
