## **Frequently asked questions (FAQs) for participants**

### **What is the project?**

We aim to enhance our understanding of how universities prepare students for graduate life and work (employability), and to enable these strategies to be embedded into the curriculum.

### **Will I be identified?**

You will not be identified. Your responses will go to a lead researcher, who will de-identify everything before anyone sees it. Your teachers will not see your response.

### **Why should I participate?**

Very little is known about how students develop the skills and knowledge required to negotiate their future lives and careers. This makes it hard to advocate for change or to support good practice. We are creating a unique picture of career and study confidence and we hope that the data will help to achieve these aims.

### **What will this involve?**

We ask you to share your self-assessment responses. We might invite you to be part of a focus group, but you can say no.

### **Who are the researchers?**

The lead researcher is Dawn Bennett, who is a higher education researcher with Bond University in Queensland, Australia.
